Inequality and social injustice fuel the tensions that cause most conflicts so we need to address these. Our 2015 theme is about getting people involved more in making equality real in a world where:

- resources are used to meet the needs of the many and the vulnerable rather than being monopolised by the few;
- the human rights of all are respected and conflicts are resolved peacefully and fairly;
- our planet is conserved for future generations.

To achieve this we need to have confidence that our actions can contribute to the changes we seek. Hope that leads to action is much more powerful than passive optimism that it will all come right in the end.

Many of us are building a culture of hope and equal respect in our families and communities; acting together we can be part of a movement for change worldwide.

This year, OWW invites YOU to organise or support activities in your local communities that explore ways of promoting equality. Choose to focus on a particular inequality or invite a range of organisations to inspire action. The OWW website will guide you to organisations and examples from around the world of people acting together to achieve social justice.

You can also use these examples to inspire hope and action via social media.

Be part of this "HOPE in ACTION" that draws in the whole community to make equality real!

OWW works in partnership with other national organisations. We develop the annual theme together and share resources and information. The Week offers opportunities for partners and supporters to set up or take part in local OWW events in solidarity with the vulnerable worldwide.
