# INCLUDING YOU

Acting Together for One World in Peace

Everyone is affected by the impacts of migration and refugees, diversity and inclusion, extremism, Islamophobia and racism. Our society needs to think in new ways to understand these issues and address the causes and effects to enable us all to live together in peace.

Reactions to terrorist attacks and to the arrival of refugees in Europe suggest that OWW should draw on its tradition of bringing people together to hear each other's perspectives and share common values.

We, therefore, encourage people to work together locally to:

- listen to our local and global neighbours' fears and hopes,
- raise understanding by telling peoples' stories of why they moved,
- identify and address underlying reasons for why people flee (environmental ruin, insecurity, poverty, conflict, ...),
- offer support and uphold the rights of those who suffer discrimination and abuse.

You may choose to focus on a particular situation, or invite a range of involved organisations to inspire action. The OWW website will guide you to examples from around the world of people building social justice. You can also 'act together for one world in peace' by sharing these stories via social media.

Be part of this movement that draws in the whole community to spread hope and inspire action by sharing stories and defusing myths to build a culture of inclusion.

OWW works with other national organisations to develop the annual theme together, sharing resources and information. Throughout the year, our website [www.oneworldweek.org](http://www.oneworldweek.org) draws attention to activities that relate to the theme.

The Week offers opportunities for everyone to set up or take part in local OWW events in solidarity with the vulnerable worldwide. At your events, don't forget OWW is an awareness-raising charity which needs core financial support for this work.
