PEACE PLEDGES

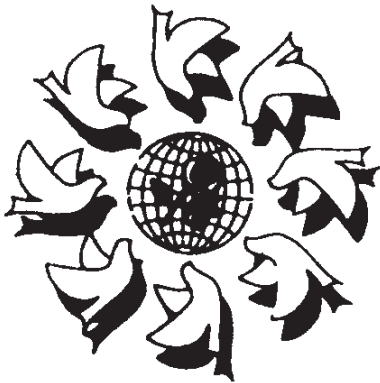
Not able to organise an event but still want to be involved? Why not make a pledge for peace?
